2008 Season Preview

The University of New Haven women's lacrosse team enters the 2008 season with very high expectations, perhaps the highest in the eightyear history of the program. Head coach **Jen Fallon**, a former All-American at Sacred Heart, leads the Chargers, who are looking to build upon their 7-10 record last season. That matched a program high for wins in a season. The Chargers lost only two seniors and return twelve players from last year's team.

"We are definitely out to improve upon our record from a year ago, and I think we have the personnel to be able to do that," says Fallon. UNH is led by captains **Brigid Brady**, **Mallory Ferrandiz**, and **Heather Miles**. Both Ferrandiz and Miles are returning from injuries and each missed significant time last season. "We're excited to have Heather return after red-shirting last season. She brings experience and good game sense along with her ability to finish a scoring play."

Ferrandiz, who tallied 63 points as a freshman two years ago is looking to make an impact on the team in her third season. "We are also looking forward to Mallory's return. She is such a complete player and the person on the field that can really dictate the pace of things."

Junior captain **Brigid Brady** is aiming to repeatedly find the back of the net, as she has had no problems doing. Over the past two seasons, Brady has accumulated 129 points, including an impressive 114 goals. She currently leads UNH all-time in goals and points. "Brigid is a competitor that goes out every day with the intention of helping her team win games. She is a natural attacker and we are finally deep enough

that we can move her out of the midfield and on to

the attack where she can really focus her energy."

Kristine Lambracht, Sarah LeGoff, Brianna Kenworthy and Stephanie Usseglio have all developed a sense of confidence over the last year. "Sarah has a quick first step and finishes well. Kristine is one of our hardest working athletes. She gets the job done on both ends of the field and despite her offensive output last season, will likely be one of our strongest defensive players this year. Brianna is the fastest player on the team and will look to be a force for us offensively. Stephanie works hard on attack and will likely contribute offensively."

Ashley Griffin, one of the team's most agressive de-

fenders, will certainly be a difference-maker on the defensive end. She will be the defensive leader in front of the Chargers' less experienced goalkeepers. Coach Fallon also points out junior defender **Stacey Krasnoff** "has come along way in a short period of time and I'm excited to see how her development at practice transfers to the game field."

Sophomore **Maryellen Shea** also will contribute heavily on the defensive end. "She is a well-rounded athlete and a strong player on the draw circle," says Fallon. Sophomore **Laura Cote** and senior **Erin Metcalf** round out the defender.

The 2008 freshman class will certainly be tested this season. Both freshman goalkeepers, **Shannon Kilburn** and **Shannon Greenwood**, are expected to see the field this season. Fallon notes, "they will likely split time—but both are seeing the ball well and improving every day."

Expected to make an immediate impact in the midfield is freshman **Ashley Ferrandiz**, sister of junior Mallory. "She sees the field well and the spark she provides is fun to watch." Fellow freshmen **Nicole Van Leer**, **Carolina Marrero**, and **Lisa Barnard** are scoring threats that will round out the offense.

Jen Fallon will enter her second season as the head coach of the women's lacrosse team at the University of New Haven in the spring of 2008. Fallon will look to improve upon the 7-10 record from her first season in 2007, when the Chargers played five top-10 nationally ranked programs. UNH finished up the 2007 campaign with an emphatic 12-11 win over tenth-ranked Philadelphia University, and had a pair of all-Region selections.

Fallon was an All-American lacrosse player and soccer star for Sacred Heart University from 1992-96, and went on to become the Pioneers' head women's soccer coach from 1997-2000. Fallon also served as the school's assistant compliance coordinator for two years while coaching.

Most recently, Fallon was the head girl's lacrosse coach and physical education teacher at Greens Farms Academy in Westport, Conn., with additional duties in the areas of policy & curriculum and athletic game management.

"Jen brings a wealth of high-level lacrosse experience to New Haven," said UNH Athletic Director Deborah Chin at the time of Fallon's appointment. "She earned All-America honors at the Division II level and knows what it takes to succeed on and off the field. We are excited that Coach Fallon is joining the Charger family."

As a collegiate lacrosse player, Fallon was a three-time Division II All-America selection (1994-96) and is Sacred Heart's all-time scoring leader with 264 career points. She scored 212 career goals with 52 assists, and in her All-American seasons posted three of the school's top four single-season point totals. She is 20th on the D-II national career scoring list, and is ninth all-time in goals scored.



In soccer, Fallon was a four-time All-New England and All-Northeast selection, adding three All-Conference awards. She is still the school's all-time single-season and career scoring leader.

"I'm excited for the opportunity to be a part of this program and the University of New Haven," Fallon said. "I look forward to continuing the progress that this team has already made. One of my goals is to keep the UNH women's lacrosse program moving toward being one of the top ten teams in Division II."

A native of Milford, Conn., Fallon earned her bachelor's degree in psychology from Sacred Heart in 1996. She is a member of the U.S. Lacrosse Association, the CGSCA and NSCAA, and is CPR and AED certified. She resides in Fairfield, Conn.


ASSISTANT COACH FOURTH SEASON WOOSTER, 2003


