

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL IN THE ATHLETICS ALUMNI HALL OF FAME

Cathy Alston '92

- The first 1,000-point scorer in New Haven women's basketball history, Cathy Alston remains 12th all-time at UNH with 1,310 career points.
- As of January 2016, she ranks fifth in career assists with 451 and slots at seventh all-time with 251 career steals. Alston also continues to rank among the top-10 in a single season in assists (151 in 1981-82, ninth) and steals (82 in 1983-84, tied-ninth).
- Over her four years at New Haven, Alston helped lead the Chargers to a record of 65-45, while advancing to the New England Collegiate Conference championship game in 1982-83 and 1983-84.

Sonja Beamon '94

- Team captain of the 1987 National Championship team, Sonja Beamon averaged 12.5 points and 9.1 rebounds per game for that women's basketball squad that hoisted the trophy.
- Beamon also earned All-New England Collegiate Conference honors that season to cap a career in which she posted 1,208 points and 901 rebounds.
- She guided the Chargers to 78 wins and a .667 winning percentage during her career at UNH and currently ranks 15th all-time in scoring and fifth in rebounding.

Carolyn Bell '99

- After graduating as the school's all-time leader in steals, Bell remains among the leaders in two categories to this day, assists (6th, 372) and steals (5th, 281).
- She is among the top-10 in a single season in the same two categories with both set during the Chargers run to the championship in 1986-87.
- In steals, she finished that season with 82, which is tied for ninth in a single season, while she is 10th in assists with 137.
- In addition, Bell earned a spot on the All-New England Collegiate Conference second team as a senior and consistently finishing among the team's leaders in most offensive categories.

Jennifer Davis '09

- With a career total of 1,622 points, Davis is one of only seven UNH women's basketball players to score more than 1,500 points in their career.
- She played in all 108 games during the four years of her career, including three postseason appearances.
- During her senior season, Davis scored a career-high 540 points, ranking her seventh in the single-season record book at UNH, while shooting 43.2% from the floor and 75.7% from the foul line.

Arnetha Eaddy '93

- Arnetha Eaddy was one of the first stars of the University of New Haven basketball program and became only the second player to score 1,000 career points, reaching the mark in 1985.
- Eaddy earned All-New England Collegiate Conference honors as a basketball player in 1983 and 1984.
- Eaddy also enjoyed success as a volleyball player, spending four seasons with the program. She earned All-NECC honors in her senior season and was named the team's co-captain the same year.

Tiesha Grace '10

- One of only two players to record 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in the University of New Haven women's basketball history, Tiesha Grace-Cobb ranks as one of the most productive players to ever play on the UNH basketball court.
- Grace-Cobb totaled 1,347 points, 1,047 rebounds, 170 steals, 105 assists and 71 blocks during her four seasons. The Roosevelt, N.Y. native recorded 47 career double-doubles, shot over 43 percent from the field and played in nearly 100 games.
- She still ranks second in rebounds and currently ranks 11th in scoring. She also has two of the top ten single-season rebounding marks and helped guide the Chargers to four-straight postseason appearances.

Niketa Harris '02

- One of 14 players in program history to record 1,000 points and 500 rebounds.
- Currently third all-time in scoring with 1,673 points and her 15.8 points per game average.
- Currently 10th all-time in career rebounds with 785.
- led the team in scoring as a junior and senior, including with her 534 points as a senior currently ranking as the eighth most in a single season in program history.
- Also ranks second in career free throws with 409 and fifth in career field goals with 632.

Ashley Hilton '14

- A two-time conference player of the year, Ashley Hilton ranks fifth in the history of New Haven women's basketball with 1,637 career points.
- An All-America honoree from two organizations as a senior, she guided the Chargers to consecutive ECC Championships and NCAA postseason appearances in 2006 and 2007.
- In addition to her point total, Hilton ranks among New Haven's all-time leaders in games played, field goals, field goal percentage, three-point percentage, free throw percentage, rebounds and blocked shots.

Christine Huber '08

- Christine Huber is the definition of a two-sport star, playing for the UNH women's basketball and soccer teams from 1996-2000. Huber was a four-time all-conference selection and is second all-time in scoring for the women's soccer program.
- Huber was a three-time all-conference selection and still ranks eighth in career scoring (1,453 points) and 10th in career rebounding (764).
- She played in 107 games, averaging 13.6 points and 7.1 rebounds and 1.9 steals per game for her career.
- UNH advanced to the NECC tournament all four years she played, including a title game appearance during Christine's senior campaign.

Joy Jeter '95

- One of the greatest players in the history of New Haven women's basketball, Joy Jeter is the program's all-time leading scorer and rebounder.
- A three-time All-America honoree, Jeter racked up 2,299 points and 1,486 rebounds in a career that also included two ECAC Player of the Year awards and an NECC Player of the Year nod.
- She was the Most Valuable Player of the NCAA Tournament in 1987, capping her season with 30 points and 15 rebounds against Cal-Poly Pomona as the Chargers won the University's first national championship.

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Marcia McNeil '88

- A two-sport standout at New Haven, Marcia McNeil was an offensive leader who helped build the foundation for both the women's basketball and women's volleyball programs.
- A two-year starter and three-year letterwinner on the hardwood, McNeil helped the team to its first-ever EIAW Division II postseason appearance and, at the time of her Hall of Fame induction, ranked 10th in program history in points (688) and rebounds (367).
- McNeil captained the volleyball squad during her senior campaign, helping build a foundation of excellence as New Haven won its first of nine straight New England Collegiate Conference Championships.
- A four-year star on the volleyball court, she was one of the top hitters for Head Coach Deborah Chin as the Chargers reached the postseason in each of her four seasons.

Debbie Moore '13

- Moore finished her career as UNH's third-most prolific scorer and rebounder, and continues to rate as the fourth-highest scorer (1,667 career points) and seventh-best rebounder (817 career rebounds).
- She is also second in career steals and ninth in career assists for the Chargers.
- She finished her career scoring 10 or more points in more than 75 games and 10 or more rebounds in more than 30 games.

Gina Paolillo '85

- Fittingly, the first woman inducted into the New Haven Athletics Hall of Fame is also the first female athlete at UNH to letter in three sports.
- Combined among her three primary sports, Paolillo finished with a career record of 146-133 which included the Chargers first ever women's postseason appearance by the 1978 volleyball team.
- The first ever recruit for Coordinator of Women's Athletics Deborah Chin, Paolillo was a member of the inaugural softball, women's basketball and women's volleyball teams and was an avid runner.

Jan Rossman '00

- The architect of the first team to win a National Championship in New Haven athletics lore, Jan Rossman coached UNH women's basketball from 1983-87.
- She compiled a 78-39 (.667) record for the Chargers, ranking her third all-time in wins, fourth in winning percentage and third in games coached at UNH.
- In addition to the 1987 NCAA Division II National Championship, Rossman earned back-to-back New England Collegiate Conference titles and was lauded as the NECC Coach of the Year in each of those campaigns.
- Also the 1987 WBCA District Coach of the Year, Rossman mentored two NECC Players of the Year and two All-Americans – Joy Jeter and Charlene Taylor.

Stephanie Seymour '90

- Stephanie Seymour was an all-around threat who helped build the foundation for both the New Haven softball and women's basketball teams. On the diamond, she allowed just seven earned runs in 66 career innings in the circle for a 0.74 earned run average.
- On the court, Seymour scored over 600 career points – ranking in the program's all-time top-10 at the time of her graduation – with over 100 steals and nearly 200 assists.
- Combined between women's basketball and softball, Seymour led the Chargers to 88 victories.

Becky Snow '11

- One of the greatest two-sport athletes in the history of Charger Athletics, Becky Snow excelled on the basketball court and the softball field from 1996 to 2000. She ranks as one of the greatest hitters in UNH softball history and one of the greatest scorers in UNH women's basketball history.
- In four years at UNH, Snow played in over 275 combined games and helped lead the Chargers to four postseason appearances.
- She holds the record for career three-pointers with 235 and ranks seventh all time with 1,551 career points. She also holds the top four single-season totals for three-pointers.
- On the softball field, Snow finished her career with four postseason selections and a .309 batting average. At the time of her graduation, she ranked fourth all-time in at-bats, eighth all-time in hits and 10th all-time in runs batted in.

Terri Stahl-Sells '06

- A versatile student-athlete, Terri Stahl-Sells wore the Blue and Gold with pride for four seasons on the basketball and tennis courts and the softball field. As a senior, when she captained both the basketball and softball teams.
- Among her career highlights, Stahl-Sells started 30 games on the hardwood helping the Chargers to the 1987 National Title. During that magical 1986-87 basketball season, Terri raised her level of play to finish the season averaging 9.9 points and 5.8 rebounds per game.
- Along with her basketball prowess, she was one of the anchors of the softball pitching staff from 1984-1987, earning All-Conference honors as a junior.
- Her UNH career culminated with her selection as the University's Female Athlete of the Year in 1987. After wrapping up her playing career, she served her alma mater as an assistant basketball coach for two seasons from 1988-1990.

Charlene Taylor '96

- She ranks second all-time in scoring with 1,853 points, trailing only her teammate and classmate Joy Jeter. Taylor is also the all-time leader with 603 assists and 419 steals in her career at New Haven.
- She appears three times in the top-10 for single-season assists, four times on the single-season steals ledger, and her 557 points in 1988-89 are the fifth-most in program annals.
- In addition to an All-America nod in 1989, Taylor was an ECC Player of the Year and NECC Player of the Year as well as All-New England, All-District and three-time First Team All-NECC.
- For her role in the Chargers' run to the 1987 National Championship, Taylor was selected to the NCAA All-Tournament Team.
