THE FIRST LOOK

There is a trophy on the line this weekend and it is one that has resided in West Haven since October 9, 2010 as New Haven rides a 10-game win streak in the battle of the Elm City. With a year off in the annual rivalry game due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the excitement for today's game is at levels higher than many can recall over the last decade.

INSIDE THE SERIES

- New Haven and Southern Connecticut State meet for the 32nd time in the history of the two programs.
- The Chargers hold a 24-6-1 record in the previous 31 meetings, with the all-time series dating back to 1981.
- In the 12 meetings since football returned to the Blue and Gold in 2009, the Chargers hold an 11-1 record, including winning the last 11 meetings.
- In the current streak of 11-straight wins, the Chargers have outscored the Owls by an average of two touchdowns, including a 48-9 rout in 2012.
- Among the current 11 game win streak

for New Haven is 10 straight Elm City Trophy victories.

A WIN OVER SO. CONNECTICUT WOULD...

- be the 12th straight win and 11th straight season New Haven has knocked off its crosstown rival and maintained control of the Elm City Trophy
- hand Southern Connecticut their first NE10 loss of the season
- keep head coach Chris Pincince undefeated against the Owls at 8-0
- be the 257th overall victory in the 42-plus year history of Charger Football.
- be the 226th victory since the Chargers began playing at the Division II level - first DII season was 1982.

tation and a 66% humidity level. Winds on Saturday will be around seven miles per hour out of the east. Sunrise is set for 6:42 AM while the sun will set at 6:43 p.m.

SCOUTING THE CHARGERS

The Chargers met a defense last week that tested their resolve and it came at a perfect time, one week before opening Northeast-10 Conference play against their crosstown rival. New Haven turned the ball over three times against No. 24 Bowie State and that proved to be the difference as they dropped a 27-13 decision to the visiting Bulldogs. The Chargers will once again put graduate quarterback Connor Degenhardt under center to open up league play. The Westford, Mass. native has completed 43 passes for 497 yards and three touchdowns, while in the running game he has two more TD's to his credit, a 26-yard run in the season opener and a 1-yard up the gut score as time expired against Bowie State. In addition to Deggenhardt, much of the offense will run through junior running back Shamar Logan who is averaging 77 yards per game and 4.8 yards per rushing attempt. Defensively, New Haven took care of the Bulldogs offensive line last week, breaking through for five sacks which resulted in 44 yards lost, while they also finished with 11 tackles for loss. Leading the way on the season is Ryan Hodgins who has 15 tackles to his credit, one of four players with double digit tackles on the year.

SCOUTING THE OWLS

Including a season opening road win over Division I Central Connecticut State University, Southern Connecticut enters DellaCamera Stadium with a 2-1 overall record, opening up Northeast-10 play with a 34-31 victory over Saint Anselm last weekend in their home opener. Most of the Owls offense this season has come from its passing game where sophomore quarterback Jackson Ostrowsky has completed over 60% of his pass attempts, racking up 757 yards and seven touchdowns across three games. On the ground, the Owls average just 66.7 yards per game, with nearly three quarters of their total net yards coming from junior T.J. Gardner.

NEXT ON TAP

New Haven will head on the road for the

first time in 2021 when they open the month of October at Pace University on Saturday, October 2. The Setters will be entering that game off of their bye week after dropping a 32-21 road decision at Assumption on September 18. Kickoff from Pace Stadium in Pleasantville, N.Y. is scheduled for 12:00 p.m. with all of the action available live on NE10 NOW.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF

Running back Shamar Logan picked up in 2021 right where he left off in 2019, racking up 100+ yards for the sixth time in his career in week one with 104 net yards on 20 attempts against Franklin Pierce. Right out of the gates in game one, Logan found his feet, getting the ball on the first three plays of the game where he quickly secured the first first down of the season just two plays in. Among his 20 attempts, four went for 10 or more yards, including one for 20+ and the longest of the day, a 30-yard gain that set up at 48-yard TD pass on the next play.

COSTLY MISTAKES

Take away the 21 points New Haven surrendered because of turnovers and the Chargers would be standing at 2-0 right now. The three turnovers for the Chargers is the most since a road game at Bentley in late September 2019, while the 21 points surrendered by the Chargers off those turnovers is the most since the 2018 season opening loss at Division I Bryant where they coughed up the ball four times while led to 21 points. In addition, the two fumble recoveries for a touchdown against Bowie State was the first time New Haven has given up six points on a fumble recovery since November of 2017.

ONE DEGREE ISN'T ENOUGH

With a master's program in sport management, an MBA program and a renowned school of criminal justice it is no wonder so many students call New Haven home when it comes to postgraduate degrees. This season is no different as the Chargers boast 27 grad students on the roster, which according to a new release from the National Football Foundation is the most in Division II. A total of 296 schools responded to a request for information regarding graduate students on current rosters. Two-hundred seventy-nine of those schools listed at

least one graduate student and all combined a total of 3,284 collegiate football players will take the field despite having already earned an undergraduate degree.

BOOSTING THE NUMBERS

Without needing to prepare for an opponent since November of 2019, there has been plenty of time for the Chargers coaching staff to find and recruit the next generation of New Haven players and they took full advantage of that extra time, inviting 125 players for the start of preseason camp in early August. Of the 125 total invitees to camp, 103 will enter today's game as members of the Chargers travel party. Included in that number are 32 letterman returning from the 2019 team and within that number, 14 are listed as starters for the season opener against Franklin Pierce.

LEAVE IT ALL ON THE LINE

Over the last handful of years, the Chargers offensive line has always been the biggest challenge for opponent's defensive strategies and 2021 should prove to be no different. Last season, the Chargers O-Line helped lead the offense to an average of 378 total yards per game, the fourth most among the entire NE10. Included in that number is an average of 188 rushing yards which was the third most in the conference. A year prior (2018), the Chargers O-Line contributed to 4,827 total yards on offense, the most in the NE10, which included just shy of 2,000 rushing yards. Additionally, the O-Line allowed opponents to sack quarterback Ajee Patterson just three times through the 10-game regular season in 2018.

HARDWARE HERO

A native of Brooklyn, N.Y. Shamar Logan returns to the gridiron for just the second time as a Charger and it comes after earning some impressive hardware in 2019 when he was named the Northeast-10's Rookie of the Year.

Logan finished his first season wearing Blue and Gold with 1,000 net rushing yards which ranks as the seventh most in a single season at New Haven. Those 1,000 yards came on 164 carries and included eight touchdown runs. In addition he added 13 catches for 90 yards and one touchdown. Overall in 2019, Logan finished five games with 100+ yards and three games with a pair of touchdowns. His best outing of the season came on the road at Saint Anselm where he rushed for 175 yards and picked up 21 yards on a pair of catches.

AND THE OSCAR GOES TO

Among 16 players who were named to All-Conference teams following the 2019 campaign, the Chargers return four. Highlighting the group is the 2019 Rookie of the Year

outlined above, Shamar Logan. On the offensive side of the ball he is joined by returning center Mike Zecchin who was named to the NE10 Second Team. A pair of defensive players also return after earning Second Team accolades; linebacker Ryan Hodgins and defensive back Shawn Tafe. Combined, the pair were third and fourth on the team in total tackles with 62 and 50, respectively.

LEADERSHIP TRIO

Following the Chargers three-week preseason, head coach Chris Pincince announced a trio of players that will make up the leadership corps for 2021; defensive lineman Affiz Din-Gabisi, wide receiver Brett Huber and offensive lineman Mike Zecchin. In addition to the three, a weekly game captain will be named, joining the trio for the on-field coin toss and other game-day responsibilities. All three returned to the Charger football program to extend their collegiate career after earning undergraduate degrees from the University and losing their 2020 seasons due to the CoVID-19 pandemic.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE SIDELINES

This season, New Haven welcomes a total of eight new faces who were not on the sidelines the last time the Chargers took the field in 2019. Among the new additions are two former Chargers, 2020 graduate Zach Cofrancesco who will coach the defensive back and 1987 graduate Frank Forcucci, a catcher and third baseman on the baseball team, who will lead the linebackers. In addition to be an alum, Forcucci brings a wealth of experience to the New Haven staff serving in a number of different collegiate coaching rolls since 1994, including as the head coach at Becker from 2016-2020. Also among the new additions is Beau Bell, a former linebacker at UNLV who was drafted by the Cleveland Brown in the fourth round of the NFL Draft in 2008. After being waived by the Browns, Bell would go on to win a pair of Arena Bowl Championships with the Philadelphia Soul in 2016 and 2017.

CHRIS PINCINCE HEAD COACH SEVENTH SEASON BOSTON UNIVERSITY '94

Chris Pincince takes the helm of the New Haven Chargers football team for his seventh season in 2021. Named the 10th head coach at the University of New Haven in February 2014, Pincince brought more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience to the sidelines, including many at the NCAA Division I level.

In six seasons leading the Chargers, Pincince has collected 42 wins and led the Blue and Gold to the NCAA Championship Second Round (2018) for the first time since 2012. Overall in six seasons, 11 players have received All-American accolades while offensive lineman Zach Voytek was a three-time NE10 Offensive Lineman of the Year while also signing as an undrafted free agent with the Buffalo Bills. Additionally, 47 different players have been named All-Conference, while 11 have garnered All-Region honors.

In the most recent season prior to the CoVID-19 shutdown, the Chargers finished tied with Bentley with a 6-2 record in Northeast-10 Conference play. Among the highlights for Pincince's squad was Shamar Logan garnering NE10 Rookie of the Year accolades as he was one of 16 Chargers to earn NE10 postseason distinction. Logan would go on to earn All-Region honors along with Markel Johnson and Ju'an Williams, the latter of which was named the regions Special Teams Player of the Year.

In 2018, Pincince coached a pair of record breakers in quarterback Ajee Patterson and Williams. Patterson graduated as arguably the best quarterback in New Haven history, the first to throw for more than 10,000 yards while racking up 80 touchdowns, second most in program history. The NE10 MVP and First Team All-Conference selection, Patterson closed out his collegiate campaign with a career-high 2,878 yards and 29 touchdowns, leading his squad to the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2012. Williams, a Don Hanson Honorable Mention All-American, registered a single season school record 1,171 receiving yards which came on 65 catches while completing 11 for touchdowns. Joining Williams in earning All-American accolades was Dan Iannone who anchored an offensive line that contributed to 4,827 total yards on offense, the most in the NE10, which included just shy of 2,000 yards rushing. In addition, the O-Line protection was impeccable, allowing Patterson to be sacked just three times through the 10-game regular season.

Voytek was one of two Chargers named All-American in 2016, joining linebacker Tyler Condit. Together, the pair were part of nine total players who received NE10 All-Conference honors following a 7-4 season that included a pair of wins over crosstown rival Southern Connecticut State University, representing eight straight season New Haven has maintained the Elm City Trophy. On the field, Condit set a pair of records, becoming the all-time leading tackler at New Haven as well as in the Northeast-10. He finished his collegiate career with 117 tackles as a senior, becoming just the second player in school history to finish with at least 100 stops in three seasons.

In just his second season leading the Chargers, Pincince led the Blue and Gold to the N10 Championship game, finishing the year with a 7-4 record. Among the highlights were a pair of record setting performances from junior running back Andre Anderson and Condit. Anderson broke a 22 year old record set by Roger Graham when he rushed for 319 yards in the regular season finale against Saint Anselm. In that same game, Condit shattered a 29 year old record when he finished with 25 tackles, giving him 153 for the season, which surpassed the previous record of 134 by Erik Lesinski. Anderson and Condit were two of four Chargers who received NE10 Player of the Year accolades at their respective positions, with Anderson earning Most Valuable Player accolades.

In his first season strolling the sideline at New Haven, Pincince led the Chargers to a 6-5 overall record, including a string

of six straight victories in Northeast-10 Conference action. Among the highlights from Pincince's first season was Condit who was named a USA College Football All-America Honorable Mention. A pair of Chargers were also honored among the major awards from the Northeast-10 Conference with Voytek named co-Offensive Lineman of the Year and freshman running back Lemar Thomas named Rookie of the Year. In total, 10 players were named to NE10 All-Conference squads.

With two previous stints as an assistant at New Haven, Pincince began his career with the Chargers in 1995 as an assistant for UNH Athletics Hall of Famer and former NFL coach Tony Sparano. He spent three additional seasons with the Chargers from 1999 to 2001 under Darren Rizzi, current special teams' coordinator for the New Orleans Saints.

Prior to his most recent position as offensive coordinator at NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) member Elon University in North Carolina, Pincince was the offensive coordinator at the University of Rhode Island and the College of the Holy Cross.

At Elon, Pincince was the offensive coordinator as well as the quarterbacks and running backs coach for three seasons. In his first year Elon's offense led the Southern Conference and ranked 14th nationally with 281 passing yards per game. Pincince's offensive scheme was anchored by All-America wide receiver Aaron Mellette, who led all of FCS in receptions per game (10.27) and receiving yards per game (149). His season totals also set new school and conference records in 2011. Quarterback Thomas Wilson also led the conference and ranked 14th nationally in total offense. In his second season at Elon, the offense ranked 12th in the FCS in passing yards per game (296), with Mellette again earning All-America honors. The receiver became the first Elon player invited to the Senior Bowl and was later selected in the seventh round of the NFL draft by the Baltimore Ravens. In Pincince's final season at Elon, the Phoenix ranked second in the conference in passing yards per game (231) and averaged over 350 total yards per contest.

During the three seasons prior to arriving at Elon, Pincince was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Rhode Island. While at URI, Pincince installed the spread offense, and the Rams ranked fifth in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in passing offense in his first season.

Pincince also spent four years at the College of the Holy Cross, including two seasons as the Crusaders' offensive coordinator. In 2007, the Holy Cross offense led the Patriot League in scoring (35.9 ppg), passing (335 ypg), total offense (463 ypg) and first downs (272). Crusaders quarterback Dominic Randolph led the league in passing (3,604 yards), touchdown passes (30) and total offense (340 ypg) and finished 12th in the balloting for the Walter Payton Award. Pincince's first two seasons at Holy Cross were spent as the wide receivers coach.

Prior to his tenure at Holy Cross, Pincince served as the offensive coordinator at Ursinus College in 2003. The season before, Pincince was the quarterbacks coach at Brown University. He also spent two seasons at Fairfield University.

During his five previous seasons at New Haven, the Chargers combined for a 32-18-1 record and advanced to the NCAA Division II quarterfinal round in 1995. The Chargers finished the regular season undefeated and earned a 27-12 victory over Edinboro in the opening round of the NCAA playoffs. In his second stint, the Chargers averaged over 30 points and 350 yards per game during his three-season stretch.

A native of Woonsocket, R.I., Pincince earned his bachelor's degree from Boston University in 1994. He was a member of the Terriers' 1993 Yankee Conference Championship team and played on two NCAA Division I-AA (now FCS) playoff teams. He and his wife, Jennifer, have two sons, Zachary and Owen, and a daughter, Emma.

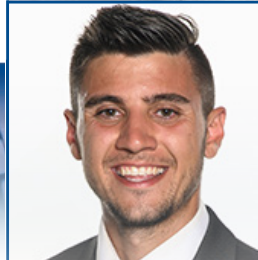

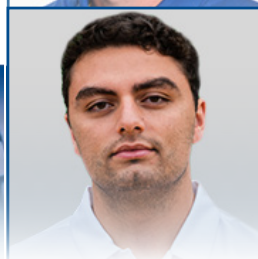
